

1. American Red Cross Young Minds Change Lives Scholarship

Amount to be awarded: Varies from \$250.-\$2500.

Deadline: April 15

The American Red Cross Scholarship will be awarded to a senior at Pike Central High School. The amount ranges from \$250 to \$2500, based on the number of units of blood collected at PC's Blood Drives during the current school year. Students are encouraged to invite adults to give blood at PC's community blood drive. As adults call to register for an appointment, they should give the students name as a reference. The number of units donated in the students name will be taken into consideration for the scholarship.

Include the following with your application:

- a) Write a one to two page essay describing any experience you have had with a PC Blood Drive and how Blood Drives impact lives.
- b) Two letters of character reference from those who know you well.
- c) Complete a Program Agreement along with the Local Application. This agreement can be found in the guidance office or in the PCHS nurse's office.

Turn this scholarship application into the Guidance Office. The award selection will be determined by the scholarship committee.

2. The Browning Club Scholarship

Amount to be awarded: \$200.

Deadline: April 15

The Browning Club is offering a scholarship for \$200. for an eligible senior at Pike Central.

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3. Bryant-Clem Scholarship

Amount to be awarded: \$500.

Deadline: April 15

The Bryant-Clem Scholarship will be awarded to a graduating senior at Pike Central High School in the amount of \$500. To be eligible, you must be planning to enroll full-time in a post-secondary program (four-year College, two-year College, technical or career college) in the fall immediately following graduation. The award will be mailed directly to the institution you plan to attend. If after being selected for the award, you cannot attend college as planned, or in the event of an early withdrawal, the scholarship award will be refunded to the Bryant-Clem Scholarship Fund.

Type a letter to the scholarship committee which includes the following items:

- a) Give a brief description of an experience or event which has occurred in the past four years that you feel has been very significant to you and your decision to attend college.
- b) Describe your post-secondary plans. What school do you plan to attend? Have you been accepted? What are your career plans?
- c) Explain why you need the scholarship.

Enclose the following items with your letter and application:

- a) A high school transcript, which includes SAT or ACT scores
- b) Three (3) letters of character reference:

- 1) One from your minister, priest, or Sunday School teacher
- 2) One from a member of the faculty at Pike Central
- 3) One from an individual of your choice

Award selection will be determined by the scholarship committee. Class rank, SAT/ACT scores, financial need, and citizenship are some of the criteria that will be used in the selection process.

4. James S. & Edith K. Boonshot Memorial Scholarship

Amount to be awarded: Varies

Deadline: April 15

Eligibility requirements:

- a) The James S. & Edith K. Boonshot Memorial Scholarship is available to all young men & women that graduate from a Pike County High School.
- b) You must enroll in college the fall after graduation from high school and be in continuous attendance.
- c) You must be a full time student – 12 credit hours each semester - and maintain a GPA of at least 2.0.
